PLANS FINALIZED FOR FORESTRY  
CONSERVATION ORIENTATION CAMP

The names of 20 high school students have been announced as participants, and final plans are being made, for the June 12-18 Conservation Camp sponsored by the University of Montana School of Forestry and the Office of the State Forester.

The purpose of the camp is to encourage outstanding Montana high school students to consider forestry as a career. The students were selected upon applications based on scholarship, interest and recommendation of teachers.

Camp directors will be Robert W. Lange, UM School of Forestry, and Don Drummond, Deputy State Forester. The camp will be held at the Goat Creek Station of the Swan River State Forest.

At the camp, and on various field trips, the boys will study timber management, fire control, logging, wildlife management, watershed management, and recreation management. They will also be transported to Missoula to visit the Bonner Mill, Visitor Center, Fire Lab, Smokejumper Center and the Forest Tree Nursery.
