> 7 HS SENIORS WIN "J" AWARDS AT UM

Seven freshman journalism scholarships for study at the University of Montana next year have been awarded to seniors in Montana high schools.

Dean Nathan B. Blumberg of the UM School of Journalism announced that the winners of the awards totaling \$1,100 were selected from "an unusually outstanding set of applications."

Winners of the tenth annual Montana Press Assn. freshman scholarships of \$150 are John Palmer of Whitefish, Karen Peck of Choteau, and Louise Fenner of Sacred Heart in Missoula.

Glenn Gilman of Alder, a senior at Sheridan high school, was awarded the Montana Broadcasters Assn. \$150 scholarship.
