Course Description:

Students will learn to make detailed harmonic and formal analysis of representative works from the Baroque period to the present.

Course Objectives:

- Further develop analytical skills introduced in Music Theory and Aural Perception I-IV
- Help students achieve a deeper level of interpretation as performers through development of their structural hearing skills and musical intuition;
- Introduce students to masterworks from a wide variety of eras and genres; and
- Prepare students for graduate level training in Music Theory.

Prerequisites: Successful completion of Music 212, Music 238, and piano functional

Assessment: Grading is based on tests, projects, daily assignments, and class attendance and participation.

3 Tests	75% (3 at 25% each)
Project	20%
Homework & Participation	5%

Attendance: Attendance and Punctuality will have the following effect on semester grade:
