MISSOULA--

The Montana Committee for the Humanities, which has home offices at the University of Montana, Missoula, will meet Nov. 17 to review grant proposals of \$10,000 or more and to review oral history project proposals.

As part of its New Directions policies, the Committee established this fall for the first time specific guidelines for oral history proposals in Montana. The Committee, which regularly reviews proposals of less than \$10,000 each month, reviews applications for more than \$10,000 on a quarterly basis only. All grant applications for the Nov. 17 meeting are due, along with 18 copies, in the MCH office by Oct. 20.

At its last quarterly meeting Sept. 9, the Committee awarded a total of \$28,913 to the following four projects:

The Governor's Conference on Families Planning Committee, Helena, received \$12,547 for "The Governor's Conference on Families," a statewide, public conference to be in Helena Nov. 17 and 18.

The Shodair Crippled Children's Hospital, Helena, received \$13,000 for two, two-day seminars titled "The Ethical-Moral Dilemmas Involved in the Medical Management of Genetic and Birth Defects and Mental Retardation." The first seminar was in Kalispell, Sept. 22-23, and will be in Glendive, Oct. 30-31.

The Valley Resource Council, Glasgow, received a \$3,136 regrant for a public program on the effects of industrial development in rural communities titled "Choosing a Future: Northeastern Montana at the Crossroads."

The University of Montana Institute for Social Research, Missoula, was awarded \$230 in additional funds for a July through September planning grant titled "Planning Public Meetings on Socio-Cultural Effects of Natural Resource Developments in the Vicinity of Troy, Montana."

After the Sept. 9 meeting, the total number of 1978-1979 projects funded came to 18, with \$119,970 remaining to be regranted.
