SPECIAL HOME EC WORKSHOP
IS OFFERED AT UM

A special, two-credit home economics course will be offered at the University of Montana beginning Monday, June 20, and running to Friday, June 24.

The course, "Teaching Home Economics to the Special Education Student," is designed to help home economics teachers and other teachers who work with educable retarded students, according to Mrs. Vanetta Lewis, UM assistnat professor of home economics and director of the workshop.

The workshop is being offered as a 499 home economic course or as a 490 education course. It may be taken for either two undergraduate or graduate credits, or as a listener without academic credit.

Meeting times for the workshop are set for 8:40 to 11:10 a.m. and 2:00 to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

No special registration day has been designated. Persons interested in attending the workshop should contact the UM home economics department, 243-4841, or attend the first session and complete their registration then.
