STUDIES SEMINAR IN TAIWAN

MISSOULA--

Randolph Malahowski, University of Montana junior majoring in forestry, is one of 80 Americans invited to attend the 1979 Seminar on China Studies for International Youth, slated this summer in the Republic of China (Taiwan).

Malahowski, a graduate of Butte Central High School, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Malahowski, former Butte residents now living in Missoula.

The seminar, which will be in session June 22 through July 30, is sponsored by the National Chengchi University, Teipei, Taiwan, and the China Youth Corps.

Participants will stay in a dormitory at the university as guests of the corps. From this base, they will travel throughout the country, visiting botanical gardens, universities, a Confucian temple, museums, a nuclear power plant, and other points of interest.

During their trip, they will have several sessions of Chinese language study.

According to Margaret McGuire, UM foreign student adviser, Malahowski's invitation to the seminar stems in part from his contribution to the success of a program presented in October at the UM by the Youth Goodwill Mission of the Republic of China. Malahowski is vice president of the UM International Students Association, which sponsored the program, and, McGuire adds, the first American to hold an office in the association.
