UM SCIENTISTS GARNER HONORS AT MEETING dwyer/jg 6/22/79 state

MISSOULA--

A student and a faculty member from the University of Montana were honored during the Pacific Division meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) June 3-7 at the University of Idaho, Moscow.

Patricia L. Meinhardt, Billings, a graduate student in botany, won the \$100 prize for the outstanding graduate student paper presented to the Pacific Section of the Botanical Society of America. Her paper was titled Sesquiterpene lactones in glandular trichomes of Artemisia nova. The research for the paper was done in cooperation with Dr. Rick G. Kelsey and Dr. Fred Shafizadeh of the UM Wood Chemistry Laboratory.

Dr. David E. Bilderback, UM botany professor, was named to a five-year term on the executive committee of the Pacific Division of the AAAS. He was also re-elected secretary-treasurer of the Pacific Section of the Botanical Society of America, which meets with the AAAS each spring.
