FRIENDS OF UM LIBRARY GET  
\$3,000 ANONYMOUS GIFT

The Friends of the Library of the University of Montana has received an anonymous \$3,000 gift.

Dr. Ludvig G. Browman, FOL member and UM zoology professor who arranged the unrestricted gift, said the money could be used in any manner the Friends of the Library see fit. Browman commented that this was a very substantial contribution in terms of what it could do for the library.

The presentation was made to Ed Pope, executive vice president of the FOL and Art Deschamps, FOL board member.

The Friends of the Library was formed several years ago by faculty members and Missoula residents who believed the University of Montana library should be enriched and enlarged in ways other than just textbook additions. Since that time membership and support has spread throughout the state.

The FOL has thus far arranged many gifts of books such as the Original Journals of Lewis and Clark and first editions of Montana authors as well as obtaining substantial stipends which were used to purchase microfilms, books and documents for the University library.
