## UM OFFERS HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS CAREER AND COLLEGE COUNSELING

University of Montana deans, department chairpersons and faculty members will help Missoula high school students plan for college and careers during "UM Weeks" at Hellgate, Sentinel and Loyola High Schools.

The programs will be at Hellgate Dec. 3-7, Sentinel Dec. 10-14, and Loyola Dec. 12-14.

The Hellgate and Sentinel students will hear about courses of study offered at the UM and the careers open to graduates with majors in various areas. They will also receive advice about high school courses to take to prepare them for various UM degree programs.

The Loyola program will feature subject-matter presentations by UM faculty members. Instead of telling the students about a UM course, the professor will present an actual lecture such as would be given in a college classroom.
