NATION'S FORESTRY SCHOOLS WILL
REVISE SENIOR SEQUENCES
FOLLOWING UM LEADERSHIP

Improvement of forestry education in the United States by tailoring curriculums to a revised sequence similar to one developed by the University of Montana School of Forestry is the announced goal of the National Council of Forestry School Executives.

Dr. Arnold W. Bolle, dean of the UM forestry school, has been selected chairman of the council and will lead the implementation of the nation-wide curriculum revision in the senior sequence in forestry.

The revised sequence, currently employed by the UM forestry school, provides a broad, integrated, multiple-use approach to forest land management.

In conjunction with Dr. Bolle's selection as chairman, the council authorized a request of the Society of American Foresters to fund a three year study to implement the revision.

Dr. Bolle reported the revision was originally made at UM on the recommendation of the Society and the National Academy of Sciences.

He said the council also was interested in the UM forestry school's revised senior sequence because of the school's continued efforts to update curriculum to meet the needs of foresters today.
