TWO WIN NEW NW PETERBILT SCHOLARSHIP

MISSOULA--

University of Montana students Pamela Meismer, Missoula, and Margaret Billquist, Anaconda, have been named as recipients of the newly established Northwest Peterbilt Company Scholarship for the academic year 1979-80. Each student received an award of \$500.

Pamela Meismer, daughter of Harvey and Lilie Willison of Arlee, is a senior majoring in business management.

Margaret Billquist is a sophomore business administration major. She is the daughter of Olaf and Avalon Billquist of Anaconda.

The Northwest Peterbilt Scholarship is being awarded for the first time this academic year. It was established with a \$1000 contribution from the Billings office of Northwest Peterbilt. The contribution will be repeated annually to make the scholarship available in the future, according to Rodney C. "Rocky" Carlson, president of Northwest Peterbilt.

To be eligible for the scholarship students must be residents of Montana with a trucking industry background. They must be full-time students in the top half of their class who are majoring in business-related fields.
