EINSTEIN CENTENNIAL EXHIBIT ON VIEW AT MANSFIELD LIBRARY

MISSOULA--

The Einstein Centennial Exhibit, sponsored by the Institute for Advanced Study, the American Chemical Society, the American Institute of Physics, and the National Endowment for the Humanities, will be on display through Jan. 25 in the lobby of the Maureen and Mike Mansfield Library at the University of Montana.

Einstein's scientific work, presented in layman's terms, is a main feature of the exhibit, but even more space is devoted to Einstein's extensive public and political work, his role in world culture, his philosophy, and his quality as a human being.

The exhibit, a free-standing framework of 24 panels, features an authoritative text prepared by leading historians, a rich selection of quotations, and photographs, drawings and manuscripts drawn from a wide variety of sources and reproduced in overlay on the display panels.

The exhibition in the library lobby is open to the public Monday through Thursday from 8 a.m. to midnight, Friday from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m., Saturday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., and Sunday from 1 to 11 p.m.
