DRUG INFORMATION OFFERED BY UM PHARMACY STUDENTS

Information on non-prescription drugs will be offered by University of Montana pharmacy students at the fifth annual "Over-the-Counter Drug Information Fair," Friday, Feb. 1, at the University Center Mall, and Saturday, Feb. 2, at Southgate Mall.

The public is invited to attend the fair, which will be in session from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the University Center, and from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. at Southgate Mall. Upperclass students will be available to answer questions about the drugs and pharmacy supplies on display.

The 1980 fair, sponsored by Kappa Epsilon, a women's student pharmacy honorary society, will provide information regarding such products as antacids, birth-control products, obesity-control aids, sunscreens and topicals, internal analgesics, stimulants, and cough and cold suppressants. The display products, provided through the courtesy of Missoula-area pharmacies, will not be for sale.

In addition, students will also explain techniques used in cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR), an emergency procedure used to revive the heartbeat and breathing in heart-attack victims. There will be no admission charge.
