The University of Montana football team will play five home games and five road games in 1980, announced Grizzly Athletic Director Harley Lewis.

Montana, under first-year head coach Larry Donovan, will open its 1980 season Sept. 13, hosting Simon Fraser University.

Home games at Dornblaser Stadium begin at 1:30 p.m. The exception will be Oct. 25, when UM hosts Eastern Washington in UM's homecoming game. Kickoff for that game is 2 p.m.
