GRIZZLIES HOST MSU, EWU FRIDAY/
UM'S WEBER SHARES BIG SKY TRACK
ATHLETE-OF-THE-WEEK HONORS

MISSOULA--

The University of Montana men's track team will host its second meet in as many weeks Friday, April 11, when Montana State and Eastern Washington compete in a triangular on the Dornblaser oval.

In conjunction with the men's meet, the UM women's team will host MSU and EWU. The women's meet starts at 2:30 p.m., while the men's begins at 3 p.m.

Senior Larry Weber's double victory in UM's meet last week with Boise State and the Calgary Track club earned the Olympia, Wash., native co-Big Sky Track Athlete-of-the-Week honors.

Weber, UM's record holder in the 800 meters (1:49.65), and the defending Big Sky 800 (outdoors) champion, won the 800 (1:51.94), 1500 (3:49.98) and ran a leg on the winning 1600-meter relay team last Saturday.

Grizzly coach Marshall Clark said, "Larry, along with four or five other kids, is doing a super job thus far this season for us. I have to be careful not to let them do too much. Larry should be able to make it to the national level this season."

Clark added that MSU and EWU, "will be very strong teams. We just give up too many points in the sprints and the long jump. Last week we gave up 36 points in those events. Our strength on the track is in the 800 meters and up."

"The triangular should make things interesting in the scoring," Clark continued. "We are very strong in some events and could pick up a lot of points in those areas."

UM won the triangular last year against the two schools with 102 points. MSU had 49, and EWU 71. The Grizzlies have won every meet with MSU since 1967.
