GRIZZLIES SIGN SAN JOSE'S BRUMFIELD
TO NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT TO JOIN
THE BASKETBALL PROGRAM

MISSOULA--

Ron Brumfield (pronounced Broom-Field) a 6-7 forward from San Jose's Willow Glen High School, has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball at the University of Montana, announced Grizzly head coach Mike Montgomery.

Brumfield is the fourth and final recruit for the UM basketball program. The Grizzlies have previously announced the addition of David Johnson, a 6-4 lead guard from Los Angeles; Doug Selvig, a 6-3½ guard from Plentywood's (MT) Outlook High School and 6-4 forward Rob Hurley from Anaconda High School in Montana.

Brumfield averaged 20 points and 10 rebounds per game at Willow Glen. He was MVP of the Santa Teresa League his junior season, a first league pick as a senior and a first team all-Central Coast Selection last year.

Willow Glen finished the season with a 25-5 record and was third in the Central Coast Section. His prep coach was Bob Burton.

"Ron is a 6-7 forward who gives us some size in the future," said Montgomery. "He is a good outside shooter, who is young and should hopefully grow, and help our program in the future.

"He played for an outstanding team, and comes to the University of Montana a proven winner."

Brumfield will graduate near the top of his class, and maintains a 3.4 (on a 4.0 scale) grade-point average.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Jim Brumfield of San Jose, Calif., he was born Oct. 6, 1962.

"We are really excited about the four student-athletes we have added to our program," Montgomery said. "They are the type of kids who will fit well into our program. They all have excellent basketball potential. They are players who will keep our program at a highly competitive level." ###
