FOUR-YEAR FORESTRY SCHOLARSHIP GIVEN BY LUMBER COMPANY

Missoula--

The Plum Creek Lumber Co., Columbia Falls, has made a grant of \$2,500 to the University of Montana Foundation to establish a scholarship in the UM School of Forestry. The scholarship will be given to a worthy freshman entering the UM to work for a degree in forest management.

To be selected for the Plum Creek Scholarship, a recipient must have shown high scholastic achievement in high school and must have demonstrated potential to become a leader both in school and in his or her professional pursuits following graduation.

The award will be \$625 per year for four years, to be renewed automatically each year as long as the student maintains high standards in the forest management curriculum.

Benjamin B. Stout, dean of the UM School of Forestry, said it is hoped the first award can be made to an incoming freshman in the fall of 1980.

John Milodragovich, chairman of the Alumni Association of the UM School of Forestry Scholarship Committee, said that the first scholarship recipient will be selected this spring.

The Plum Creek Scholarship grant went originally to the Forestry School Alumni Association and was forwarded to the UM Foundation for fund management. The UM Foundation is a non-profit corporation established in 1950 to raise and manage private funds for the benefit of the educational programs of the University of Montana.
