"HUMAN SEX AND SEXUALITY" COURSE FOR EDUCATORS SLATED

MISSOULA--

Dr. Deryck Calderwood, professor and director of the Human Sexuality Program at New York University, will teach a course in "Human Sex and Sexuality" June 9 through 13 at the University of Montana. Advance registration by May 15 is required.

Calderwood holds a Ph. D. in family life from Oregon State University. He is an international consultant and widely published author in the field of sex and sexuality.

He will stress methodology in the course, which is designed for persons involved in sex education and health education. Its purpose is to improve the educator's ability to discuss sex and sexuality in a group setting.

The workshop will focus specifically on the concerns and issues felt to be most important by the participants. It will cover biological aspects of sexual response, sexual orientation, standard and non-standard forms of behavior, and moral aspects of sexuality.

The course is sponsored by the Center for Continuing Education and the Department of Health and Physical Education at the UM and the Maternal and Child Health Services Bureau of the Montana Department of Health and Environmental Sciences.

The course may be taken for three undergraduate or graduate credits in health and physical education. Those taking it for credit will pay \$55 plus a \$20 recording fee. The cost is \$55 for those who take it without credit.
