ASUM ANNOUNCES 1980-81
PERFORMING ARTS SERIES

The Associated Students of the University of Montana (ASUM) Programming Office announces that its 1980-81 Performing Arts Series will have two seasons.

The first season begins Oct. 30 with two performances of "Giselle" by Ballet West, America's fifth largest ballet company, with full orchestra. On Nov. 5, the 85-piece Slovenian Philharmonic of Yugoslavia, southwest Europe's leading orchestra, will perform one evening only. On Nov. 10-11, the Twyla Tharp Dance Foundation, with America's most dynamic choreographer, will perform selected works. Gary Graffman, who has been called "one of the great living pianists," will present a concert on Nov. 25.

The second season includes classical guitarist Christopher Parkening, the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, Western Opera Theatre's presentation of "Romeo and Juliet," Spanish guitarist Carlos Montoya, and Les Ballets Trockadero de Monte Carlo.
