WORKSHOP SCHEDULED ON HOW TO BEAT INFLATION

MISSOULA--

A workshop for home economics professionals, families and others interested in living well in spite of inflation is scheduled in Kalispell Sept. 19 and 20.

The workshop, titled "Consumer Patterns and Lifestyle Assessment," will be in session at the Outlaw Inn from 7 to 10 p.m. Sept. 19 and from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sept. 20.

The program is sponsored by the Montana Home Economics Association, Montana Home Economists in Business, and the Centers for Continuing Education at the University of Montana, Missoula, and Montana State University, Bozeman.

The instructors are Audrey Peterson, assistant professor of home economics at UM, and Dr. Joye Kohl, former member of the staff of the MSU home economics department.

The workshop will show participants how to analyze their needs with regard to consumption, conservation, time use and recreation and how to identify and evaluate community resources available to meet those needs and bring them to the attention of public policy makers.

Participants may earn one credit in home economics from either UM or MSU. The registration fee is \$5 for MHEA members and \$7.50 for others. Those taking the workshop for credit will pay an additional \$20 recording fee. The deadline for preregistration is Sept. 12.
