October 6, 1919

The meeting was called to order by President Townsend. Mr. Ireland made a report on his plans of keeping the A.S.U.M. books. Mr. Ireland reported on his investigation made in regard to Mr. Peek's sweater that there is not sufficient evidence as yet to prove that Mr. Peek is entitled to one.

A motion was made and seconded that Mr. Mosby be appointed manager of the freshman football team. Motion passed.

Mr. DeMers and Mr. Griffin were appointed a committee to confer with Sadie Erickson in regard to a manager for the Sentinel. It was suggested that each member on the executive committee try to think of a person who would make a capable Sentinel manager.

Possibilities of having freshmen football games were discussed. A motion was made and seconded that a game with the Butte High School for Friday should not be considered. Motion carried.

The Budget Committee was elected. The members elected were:

Mr. Pope, faculty representative
Mr. Mooney, student representative
Mr. Townsend, student representative

A motion was made and seconded that a committee be appointed to draw up and submit to the executive committee rules regulating the management of the A.S.U.M. store and a by-law regarding the payment of the manager of the Sentinel, the by-law to be subsequently submitted for the approval of the student body. The motion carried. The following committee was appointed:

Mr. Freeman
Mr. Ireland
Mr. McHaffie

Mr. Townsend told of the Northwest Student Government Conference which was organized at Seabeck last spring, from which council the student governments of the colleges represented may get information concerning questions of student government. Information may be obtained from the Corresponding Secretary of the organization, Mr. E. K. Lindley of the University of Idaho.

The question of Homecoming was discussed. Mr. Townsend suggested that the student body cooperate with the city Chamber of Commerce in this matter.

The Abel Memorial was discussed. Mr. Griffin reported

on his conference with Dean Stone, who is in charge of the services. It was suggested that a mass meeting of the students and faculty be held to raise funds for the memorial. A motion was made and passed that the President appoint a student to confer with the faculty regarding the Memorial services.

A motion was made and seconded that Mr. Baird be chosen manager of the debate. Passed.

A motion was made and passed that the manager of the A.S.U.M. be empowered to hire a trainer for the football team, wages not to exceed \$1.00 a day. Motion passed.

It was decided that the officers of the Kaimin be empowered to buy a cut of the football team if they so desire.

The president authorized the secretary to notify the manager of the store, the manager of the Kaimin, and the business manager of the A.S.U.M. to submit financial statements at the next regular meeting of the executive committee.
