BOZEMAN MAN WINS \$500 SCHOLARSHIP AT UM

MISSOULA--

Brian E. Lee, Bozeman, a junior in communication sciences and disorders at the University of Montana in Missoula, has received a \$500 Gute Scholarship for study at UM.

Lee, son of Marian L. Lee, Bellingham, Wash., is a 1978 graduate of Bozeman Senior High School.

While at UM Lee has been an active member of the Circle K service club and a leader in the Alethia College Ministries program. After receiving a bachelor's degree from UM, Lee intends to go on in graduate work in communication sciences and disorders.

The Gute Scholarship is awarded on the basis of the high moral character of a UM student who has gained the respect of UM faculty and students. The scholarship is given by Mr. and Mrs. J.R. Gute in memory of their son Donald who attended UM. It is given from the more than \$150,000 in undergraduate scholarships administered by the UM Foundation.

Founded in 1952, the UM Foudnation over the past quarter century has become the principal source of scholarship funds for the University, providing scholarships in virtually every discipline. Many of the scholarships are offered in memory of deceased alumni, parents or firends as well as other distinguished Montanans and supporters of higher education.
