WILL GET UM ASSIST

Montana employers wanting to benefit from hiring Montana trained college graduates will be given a big assist this year by the University of Montana Placement Center.

The Center will provide two guides to employers informing them of the more than 1,000 students receiving degrees from the University during 1967.

Charles Hood, UM director of placement, said the 1967 employer guides will be available in two editions: "The Employers' Guide to Professional Trained Personnel," and "The Teachers and Administrators guide for Elementary, High School and College."

The 1967 edition is the first edition and it will be published hereafter annually. It pertains to Montana as well as out-of-state employers, giving them such information as the number of graduates from the departments and schools on the Missoula campus, statistics of the previous years' placement, and openings available to the graduates.

In 1966 the Center experienced its busiest year when it placed nearly 500 UM graduates. This year with the published guides, the Center is ready to handle requests for placement of the 1967 graduates, expected to come from all parts of Montana and the nation.

The guide is available on request and Montana employers are urged to consult them and the UM Placement Center in Missoula for assistance in hiring college trained employees.
