REGISTRATION FOR UM EVENING CLASSES
BEGINS MONDAY NIGHT

Registration for winter quarter evening classes at the University of Montana will be from Monday (Dec. 12) until Dec. 30.

The registration, which is open to any adult, will be in Women's Center 208. The fee of \$16 a credit must be paid by Feb. 15.

Classes with fewer than 15 students may be cancelled.

The program includes two one-credit art courses. The drawing class will meet from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. Tuesday evenings. A water color class will meet on Wednesdays from 7 to 9.

A three-credit Principles of Economics course is offered from 7 to 9 Tuesday evenings.

The Education Department offers two three-credit course. Remedial Reading will be taught from 7 to 10 Tuesdays and Audio-visual Communications will also meet from 7 to 10 on Tuesdays.

English Department members will teach Freshman Composition for three credits on Wednesdays from 7 to 10.

Elementary German Reading, open to graduate students only will be on Monday and Thursday evenings from 7 to 9. No credit will be allowed.

General courses offered are Introduction to the Humanities on Wednesday from 7 to 10 and Introduction to the Reading of Literature on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 7:30 to 9. Both are three credit courses.

The Sociology Department will present a three credit course on Juvenile Delinquency Wednesdays from 7 to 10.

A three-credit General Semantics speech course is offered from 7 to 10 on Tuesday evenings.
