

Harland D. Seljak, an assistant professor of education at the University of Montana in Missoula, was elected to a three-year term on the Secondary Commission of the Northwest Association of Secondary and Higher Schools at the annual regional meeting of the NASHS Dec. II in Seattle, Wash.

Seljak also was elected chairman of the Montana State Committee of the NASHS at the Seattle meeting. The state committee supervises the accreditation of all junior high schools and high schools in Montana.

Before joining the UM faculty in 1967 Seljak was principal of Powell County High School, <u>Deer Lodge</u>, where he served as guidance counselor from 1952-57. He taught school at St. Ignatius High School, <u>St. Ignatius</u>, from 1946-50, and served as superintendent of schools in St. Ignatius from 1950-52. Seljak received a bachelor of arts degree in chemistry from Rocky Mountain College,

Billings, in 1942, and was awarded a master's degree in education from UM in 1950.
