UM ALUMNI VOTE  
JUBILEERS "BEST JOB"

The University of Montana Alumni Association will reward one of the noted University student music troupes with a \$1,500 assistance grant next academic year.

The Association's Board of Directors voted to assist the 1967-68 Jubileers, who are doing "one of the best public service jobs for the University," reports Hugh Edwards, Alumni executive secretary.

Under the direction of Dr. Joseph A. Mussulman, the Jubileers perform an average of one concert a week. Their material covers the musical comedy to the serious, with costumes as the occasion demands.

Dr. Mussulman said the Alumni's tangible expression of confidence in the Jubileers would help keep the singing performers one of the crack musical troupes in the Northwest.

The alumni support will directly assist the 17 students in the troupe. The grant will be used in part to defray the normal operating expenses, which in the past have cost each Jubileer up to \$100 a year for costumes and other expenses.

He said UM Associated Students funds have been awarded the last few years to reduce the cost of transportation of the Jubileers on tour in Montana.

Besides representing the total University community, the Jubileers represent the students of the University because they are all students, Dr. Mussulman said.

Some of the Alumni grant also will assist Professor John L. Lester's Opera Workshop. More than 150 musical performances are made available to the Montana public each year between the Jubileers and the Workshop.
