DISTINGUISHED AWARDS GO TO 25 UM ROTC GRADS

Missoula- The University of Montana Army ROTC department has awarded 25 of its outstanding senior ROTC with the "Distinguished Military Student Award."

The award is the highest honor a cadet can attain in the ROTC program.

To qualify the cadet must display outstanding leadership, high moral character, initiative, outstanding potential for advancement, definite aptitude, interest, be in the upper third of his ROTC class, and be an above average student in academic studies.
