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PHILOSOPHER, SOCIAL CRITIC, HISTORIAN,
VISITING UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA

W. T. Jones, a philosopher, social critic and historian, will describe "Facts, Fancies and the Liberal Arts" in a public lecture Monday (Feb. 13) at 8 p.m. in the Journalism Auditorium at the University of Montana.

In addition to his public lecture, Dr. Jones will address the Philosophy Club Sunday evening at 7:30 in LA 344 and on Monday and Tuesday he will speak in philosophy classes. His address before the Club, "A Model for Belief Systems," is a revision of a paper he read last year to the British Association for the Advancement of Science.

Dr. Jones, a professor of philosophy at Pomona College, Claremont, Calif., has written several books, including the "History of Western Philosophy." That text, for which he is best known, integrates the history of philosophical thought with social, political and literary developments.

Dr. Jones received his B.A. from Swarthmore College, his B. Litt. from Oxford, where he was a Rhodes Scholar, and his M.A. and Ph.D. from Princeton. He has received many post-doctoral grants for study and travel, including Ford and Guggenheim Fellowships. In 1963 and 1964 he lectured on many campuses as a Phi Beta Kappa Visiting Scholar.
