UM TO PRESENT TWO VIDEO TAPES ON LSD

The University of Montana ASUM Program Council will present two video tapes on LSD in the Journalism Auditorium, Tuesday (May 2) at 7:30 p.m.

Dr. Robert B. Curry, M.D., of the UM Health Service will introduce the two tapes. The first tape is a debate between Dr. Sidney Cohen, a Los Angeles psychiatrist, and Timothy Leary, a leading psychologist in the field of LSD.

Dr. Curry said, "This taped debate allows first-hand evaluation of an experienced user of the Hallucinogens."

The second video presentation will deal with a seminar held by Leary and students of the University of Oregon in Eugene. Both tapes were recorded on the Eugene campus.

Several television setups have been placed in the auditorium so as to provide maximum visibility for the entire audience.

Dr. Curry will also be available after the presentations to answer any questions that may arise for the audience. The public is invited to the sessions.
