ARTS CAMPERS TO GIVE PUBLIC PROGRAMS AT U

The Montana High School Fine Arts Camp Bands, Orchestra and Chorus will launch the second and last week of the camp with a performance Sunday (July 30) at 3 p.m. in the Cascade room of the University of Montana Lodge.

The same organizations will be joined by the ballet group for the closing program Friday (Aug. 4). Ballet and chorus will perform in the University Theater at 7:30 p.m. The two bands and the orchestra will play in the Lodge Cascade room at 8:30 p.m.

Directors are Dr. David Whitwell, symphonic band; Ralph Hartse, concert band; Gordon Childs, orchestra; Kenyard Smith, chorus, and Dana Bunnell, ballet.

George D. Lewis, camp director, said payment of one admission fee will admit patrons to both Friday evening events.

Admission will also be charged for a performance in the University Theater Thursday at 8:30 p.m. by the camp drama students, who are directed by Bruce Cusker and Beverly J. Thomas.

Camp events in the Recital Hall are free, but only a limited number of seats will be available to the public, Lewis said.

A trio of camp staffers will present a concert Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. in the Recital Hall. The performers are Zaven Melikian, violinist; Lowndes Maury, pianist, and Florence Reynolds, cellist.

Camp student groups performing in the Recital Hall are chamber music ensembles Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. and the piano workshop Thursday at 7 p.m. Dr. Reynolds and Melikian direct the ensembles. J. George Hummel directs the workshop.
