PROGRAM AT U TREATS
COMPOSING FOR FILMS

Lowndes Maury, composer of the score of "The Wonder Gloves," a UPA cartoon, will demonstrate the linkage between sound and sight in film-making at a program in the University of Montana Recital Hall Wednesday (Aug. 9) at 4 p.m.

Maury, prolific composer for motion pictures and television, will show the film twice and will illustrate at the piano how audio and visual elements are coordinated. He will have the original manuscript of the musical score at the presentation.

The program is designed for the graduate class in arranging which Maury is conducting at the University this week, but it is open without charge to anyone else interested in film-making techniques.

Maury, who lives in North Hollywood, Calif., was born in Butte and was graduated from the UM. He is spending three weeks on campus as a distinguished lecturer in music.
