STEWART BECOMES FORESTRY EDITOR

MISSOULA--

Ray Stewart, news representative in the University of Montana Information Services for the past 18 months, will become editor for the School of Forestry this month, according to Dr. Arnold W. Bolle, forestry dean.

Stewart will replace Elizabeth Hannum, forestry publications specialist for the past five years.

Dean Bolle said the editor's duties include editing, designing and producing the numerous publications of the forestry school and the Montana Forest and Conservation Experiment Station, assisting the faculty in research projects, assisting in the school's student writing program and helping to disseminate news about the school.

Mrs. Hannum will leave the University in September to marry Eldon H. Smith of Bozeman. She intends to pursue freelance writing and editing and continue her activities in natural-resource conservation.

Mrs. Hannum is a native of New York and a graduate of Bennington College. Before moving to Montana, she was production assistant and literary secretary to playwright Arthur Miller.

Stewart comes from Havre and has a degree from Rocky Mountain College. He was employed by the Billings Gazette and the Livingston Enterprise before joining the University staff.
