MONTANA WORKS TO TOUR  
WITH REGIONAL ART SHOW

Six Montanans are represented in an eight-state exhibit of paintings, the first joint project of the Federation of Rocky Mountain States, Inc., reports Dr. Charles W. Bolen, Missoula.

The show, which will tour Montana and the federation's other member states this year, was selected to open the Museum of Albuquerque, N. M. As a delegate to the Rocky Mountain Governors' Conference, Dr. Bolen attended the gala opening Sept. 7.

Montana works in the collection are "The Return" by J. K. Ralston, Billings; "Water Willow in Autumn" by Isabelle Johnson, Absarokee; "Mountain Stream" by James Logan, Great Falls; "Wheat" by Walter Hook, Missoula, and "Combine 9" by Charles L. Daugherty, Bozeman.

Other states represented are Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Nevada, Utah, New Mexico and Wyoming.

Dr. Bolen, dean of the University of Montana School of Fine Arts, is the Montana member of the federation's Arts and Humanities Committee, which is comprised of the chairmen of the arts councils of the member states. The federation was created by the Rocky Mountain Governors' Conference to carry out cooperative regional projects.
