UM COED TO REIGN AT 75th HOMECOMING

One of six University of Montana coeds will reign over the University's 75th Homecoming Oct. 21-22.

University males will vote for the queen Friday, Oct. 21, and 1966 Homecoming Queen, Linda Luoma Coleman, will crown her successor that night at the traditional Singing-on-the-Steps.

The winner will preside at all homecoming festivities including the Julie London concert Friday, the parade in downtown Missoula Saturday morning, the Homecoming football game against Idaho State University, and the Homecoming dance Saturday night.

Competition leading to the selection of the six finalists began last spring when each campus living group nominated one girl. The coeds were interviewed by a panel of Missoulians and the finalists selected.

They are:

Suzanne Goodman, a UM sophomore from Butte, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William L. Goodman. Miss Goodman was nominated by Phi Sigma Kappa, and is a member of K-Dettes, Army coed drill team, and active in Associated Women Students committees. She is blond, stands 5'4", and majors in forestry.

The men of Phi Delta Theta nominated Terry Heine for homecomong queen. Daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest F. Heine, Great Falls, Terry is also a UM sophomore and a member of Kappa Alpha Theta, social sorority. She majors in foreign languages and English and is a member of the Air Force coed auxiliary, Angel Flight. She stands 5'8" and has auburn hair.

Sue Holstrom is a senior at UM and majors in elementary education. A Butte native, her parents are Mr. and Mrs. Charles Holstrom.
