## FOUR UM MEN SELECTED AS RHODES SCHOLAR CANDIDATES

MISSOULA--

Four University of Montana men have been chosen to represent the University at a state Rhodes Scholar competition to be held in December, according to Dr. Robert Turner, professor of history and institutional representative for the scholarships.

The nominees, who were chosen by a faculty committee Oct. 12, are:

Joseph J. Barnard, a senior in political science and economics from Spenard, Alaska;

James W. Fox, senior in English and French from Missoula, Mont.;

Gary D. Libecap, senior in economics from Susanville, Calif.;

Murdo W. McCrae, junior in history and political science from Billings, Mont.

If selected, the scholar will enter Oxford University in October, 1968. The scholars receive approximately 1,150 pounds per year or about \$2,900.
