THREE SOLOISTS FEATURED WITH SYMPHONETTE

Three soloists will be featured with the University of Montana Symphonette performances at Havre and Chester on Sunday, October 29 and in Cut Bank the following day.

The Symphonette is a select group of 34 student musicians, conducted by Professor Eugene Andrie.

Kristin Forssen, violinist from Missoula, will be soloist in the Mozart Concerto #5 in A major. Miss Forssen is a student of Andrie and has studied violin with Dr. Gerald Doty and Marie Runberg. She began her violin study under Ernest Halvorson. She is concertmaster of the University Symphonette, a first violinist in the Missoula Symphony and is first violin in the University "Young Artists String Quartet."

Heidi Syroid, soprano from Missoula, will sing the Recitativo and Aria "Deh vieni non tardar..." from the Marriage of Figaro by Mozart. Miss Syroid is a vocal student of Professor John Lester and studied with Assistant Professor Jane Hevener Lea, both at the University of Montana. Miss Syroid is also a violinist and violist student of Andrie. She is violist in the "Young Artists String Quartet" as well as violinist in the Symphonette and the Missoula Symphony.

John German, French horn soloist from Oilmont, Montana, will play the Concerto #4 in E flat major by Mozart. Mr. German is first horn with the Missoula Symphony and University Symphonette. He studied with Dr. David Whitwell at the University of Montana and is first horn in the University Band.

The Symphonette will appear in Havre at 2 p.m. in the Student Union of Northern Montana College on October 29. Following the Havre performance, the group will go to Chester for an 8 p.m. performance in the Civic Center. On Monday, October 30, they will perform at the Cut Bank High School gym at 8 p.m. The University of Montana Young Artists String Quartet will perform in conjunction with the UM Symphonette at the Cut Bank grade schools that afternoon.
