## "DEVIL'S DISCIPLE" IS NEXT REPERTORY PRODUCTION

MISSOULA--

Work has begun on the second production of the Montana Repertory Theater, George Bernard Shaw's melodrama, "The Devil's Disciple." The Theater will close the initial run of "She Stoops to Conquer" Sunday, October 29, according to Firman H. Brown, director of the company.

"She Stoops to Conquer" will rest until February when it joins "The Devil's Disciple" and William Shakespeare's "Julius Caesar" for a ten-day schedule. Following the Missoula performances the company will tour Montana, Idaho and Utah in a three-week production schedule.

"The Devil's Disciple" will play Nov. 30, Dec. 1 and 2 under the direction of Alan Cook, associate professor of drama and associate director of the repertory company. Richard H. James will design the scenery and the lighting with Robert Cocetti as technical director. Beverly Jane Thomas will design the costumes.

Setting of the play is during the American Revolution and deals with the attempt of a young man to make his contribution to the war and to prove himself. Roger DeBourg plays the lead role of Richard Dudgeon. Suzanne Cook will portray Judith Anderson and Jim Carney will play Anderson. Mrs. Dudgeon will be played by the company's resident actress, Eileen Gallagher. Other members of the cast are Melvon Ankeny as Titus, Linus Carleton as Uncle William, Jerry A. Charlson as Christy and Frances Morrow as Essie.

Portraying the British officers who hope to squelch the colonist's revolt are David J. Hunt as General Burgoyne, Glenn Gauer as Major Swindon, Paul B. Anderson as the Sargeant and Teddy Ulmer as the chaplain who tries in vain to save Richard's soul.
