

APRIL 11-13 SET FOR UM RODEO

MISSOULA--

Daredevil students will defy bucking broncos and other wild animals April 11-13 on the University of Montana campus during the three-day UM Rodeo.

The rodeo will be at 7:30 p.m. the three nights in the Harry Adams Field House on the Missoula campus.

Doug Holzum, Red Lodge, vice president of the UM Rodeo Club, said students from 10 colleges and universities are expected to participate in the rodeo. Formal invitations will be mailed to schools in Montana, Idaho, Utah and Washington State sometime in March.

In addition to UM rodeo riders, Holzum said he expects to see in the rodeo participants from Western Montana College, <u>Dillon</u>; Eastern Montana College, <u>Billings</u>; Montana State University, <u>Bozeman</u>; Northern Montana College, <u>Havre</u>; Brigham Young University, <u>Provo</u>, <u>Utah</u>; Idaho State University, <u>Pocatello</u>; and from several universities in Washington. MSU placed first in the rodeo last year.

A portion of funds raised from the sale of rodeo tickets will be used to pay the rodeo stock contractor, Ray Kohrs, <u>Miller Creek</u>. Holzum said funds remaining after rodeo expenses are paid will go into the UM Rodeo Club treasury. Rodeo admission fee will be \$1 per student and \$1.50 per adult. Preschool children will be admitted free.

Holzum said the UM Rodeo is approved by the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association, an affiliate of the Rodeo Cowboys Association (RCA). As stock contractor, Kohrs is sanctioned by the RCA, as are the rodeo judges and a rodeo clown, who are to be named at a later date.

Tom Brown, <u>Jefferson</u>, is president of the UM Rodeo Club and Maxine Smith, <u>Victor</u>, is secretary-treasurer.
