SIX UM STUDENTS
FROM MISSOULA
IN MUSIC THEATER CAST

MISSOULA---

Six University of Montana students from Missoula will be among 17 who will be featured in the Musical Theater presentation during "Showtime 1968" Friday and Saturday nights (Feb. 2-3) on the UM campus. Curtain time each night is 8:15 p.m.

The "Showtime" performances launch stage entertainment activities for February, which is Charter Month on the campus in recognition of the founding of the school 75 years ago this Feb. 17.

Musical Theater is under the direction of John L. Lester, UM music professor. Also featured in the "Showtime" performances will be the 15-member Jazz Workshop directed by music lecturer Frank Diliberto. The singing Jubileers will also participate in "Showtime."

Musical Theater performers from Missoula include Heidi Syroid, Susan Volkel, Douglas Dunnell, Edd Blackter, Randall Schliebe and Gloria Phillip. All but Miss Syroid are members of the Jubileers.

There will be 17 members in the singing Jubileer group, which is under the direction of Dr. Joseph Mussulman, associate professor of music. Eight of the Jubileers are new to the group and will be performing on stage with the singers for the first time in "Showtime."

Highlighting the Musical Theater portion of "Showtime" will be songs from "Carousel," "Desert Song," "West Side Story," "Carnival" and "Anything Goes."

"Showtime" performances are scholarship benefits for the UM Music School Foundation. Adult admission is \$2.50, student admission is \$1.50. A double-date special for each show will admit two adult couples for \$8 and two student couples for \$4.
