UM FACULTY ARTISTS TO PERFORM SUNDAY

A solo, a duo, a trio and a quartet will be heard in the third concert of the University of Montana chamber music series, Laurence Perry, chairman of the Music Department, announced. The free public program is scheduled Sunday (Feb. 11) at 8:15 p.m. in the Recital Hall.

Arcangelo Corelli's Trio Sonata in G (Sonate da Chiesa) will be performed by Eugene Andrie and Marie Runberg, violinists; Florence Reynolds, cellist, and Lucien Hut, pianist. A trio played by four artists may seem a contradiction in terms to the uninitiated but not to those familiar with the work. The performers explain that the interplay between keyboard and cello is so close that, in effect, they speak with one voice.

Profs. Andrie and Hut will open the concert with Johannes Brahms' Duo Sonata in G major, opus 78. Prof. Reynolds will perform J. S. Bach's Suite No. 2 in D minor for solo cello.

The program will close with the Haydn Quartet in D major, opus 64, no. 5, performed by the Montana String Quartet. The faculty resident quartet is comprised of Profs. Gerald Doty, Eugene Weigel, Andrie and Reynolds.
