CLARK SPEAKS TUESDAY ON VIETNAM

MISSOULA--

"Vietnam: The Lost War" will be topic of a speech to be given Tuesday night (Feb. 13) at the University of Montana by Bronson P. Clark, who is a staff member of the American Friends Service Committee.

Clark's presentation is sponsored by the University Public Exercises Committee. He speaks at 8 p.m. in room 103 of the Liberal Arts Building. The event is open to the public. There is no admission charge.

Clark, a program associate for the AFSC's special Vietnam effort, recently returned from his second trip to Southeast Asia, where he visited Laos and South Vietnam. Previously he visited Thailand and Cambodia.

In September 1967 Clark participated in a conference in Czechoslovakia attended by representatives of the North Vietnamese government and the National Liberation Front. Clark, whose most recent business association was as vice president of Gilford Instrument Laboratories Inc. of Oberlin, Ohio, also has been associated with Quakers in international work.
