### FORESTERS MAY CONSULT VISITING AUTHORITY

MISSOULA--

Dr. Gerald Stairs, nationally recognized authority on forest genetics and lecturer in the UM Tree Improvement Workshop, will be available for professional consultation Thursday.

Dr. George Blake, UM associate professor of forestry and workshop director, said Stairs would be available in Forestry 304, phone 243-4372, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

At 4 p.m. Thursday Stairs will conduct the forest tree physiology seminar in Natural Science 307. The seminar is open to the interested public. Dr. Stairs will discuss "Mutation Breeding in Forest Trees: a survey of the proposed evaluation of induced changes in quantitative genetic characteristics of forest trees."

Stairs is an associate professor of silviculture at the State University College of Forestry at Syracuse University, New York.
