Ruth Silvius, University of Montana soprano, will have the assistance of the University Symphonette in the final number of her senior recital, which is scheduled Monday (Feb. 26) at 8:15 p.m. in the Recital Hall. / Freddi Ibsen, Missoula, will be the recitalist's piano accompanist.

Miss Silvius will be accompanied by the symphonette, conducted by Prof. Eugene Andrie, in Samuel Barber's "Knoxville: Summer of 1915."

Other numbers on the free public program are Handel's "Let me wander, not unseen"; Verdi's "Pace, pace, mio Dio" from La Forza Del Destino; Poulenc's "Banalites"; and songs by Mozart and Mahler.

Miss Silvius is a member of the UM Theater Quintet, the University Choir and the Jubileers, who made a USO tour of the Pacific fall quarter. She belongs to Montana Masquers and has performed with the Red Door Players Summer Theater in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. She is a member of Mu Phi Epsilon music sorority.

The recitalist has studied voice at the University with John Lester and Jane Hevener Lea. She holds a DeLoss Smith Memorial Voice Scholarship.

Her parents are Mr. and Mrs. William Silvius, Fort Benton.
