NOTED PLANT PHYSIOLOGIST
TO SPEAK MONDAY AT UM

MISSOULA---

Dr. Phillip Larson, the principal plant physiologist for the Institute of Forest Genetics of the U.S. Forest Service, will speak at the University of Montana on the physiology of plant growth Monday, March 4 in room 307 of the Natural Science Building.

Dr. Larson will speak to a botany-forestry seminar on forest tree physiology, but persons interested in hearing the lecture are directed to call Dr. Mark Behan at the University.

"From Pine Needles to Wood Tracheids" will be the title of the lecture. Wood tracheids are the special cell type in wood which gives it its special characteristics and makes it useful in everything from paper making to lumber, according to Dr. Behan.
