Objectives & Goals:	We will strive to improve our oral and written proficiency in German as well as to increase our knowledge of grammar, vocabulary and idioms. Students will be given ample opportunity to speak and write in German.
Expectations:	Students are expected to attend class regularly, to be prepared for class by completing their assignments on time, to participate actively, to take notes on the material presented, to study their notes and the text conscientiously, and to attempt to improve their knowledge of the German language.
Written Work:	Compositions should be 150 words at a minimum and 175 words at a maximum. Write only on every second line. Compositions must be handed in when they are due. You must correct your mistakes. Corrected compositions are due the class period after they were returned to you. Keep a record of the kind of mistakes you make over and over again. At the end of the semester I would like to see this record.
Oral Reports:	You will be assigned three oral reports during the semester. They should be 3-5 minutes in length. You may use notes but you may not write out your report and simply read it off.
Attendance Policy:	Since classroom attendance is highly important to the learning process, the following policy will be in effect: after 6 absences your final grade will automatically be reduced one letter grade, after 12 absences 2 letter grades, etc.
Assessment	There will be 3 exams, 3 oral reports, and written assignments. Final grade will be determined in <u>approximately</u> the following way: 1/3 oral reports, 1/3 exams, 1/3 written assignments. No excuses for missing tests -, written assignments or oral reports will be accepted. Late assignments of any kind will not be accepted.
