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### University of Montana English chairman accepts Rutgers post

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### UM ENGLISH CHAIRMAN ACCEPTS RUTGERS POST

MISSOULA---

Dr. Warren Carrier, chairman and professor of the Department of English at the University of Montana since 1964, has resigned to accept the position of associate dean for Academic Affairs at Rutgers University in New Brunswick, N.J., it has been announced by UM President Robert T. Pantzer.

Dr. Carrier will depart after the spring quarter to begin his new duties on July 1. He will be associated with Livingston College, a new college which is scheduled to open on the Rutgers campus in the fall of 1969 with a planned enrollment of 4,000.

"We accept Dr. Carrier's resignation with regret and we wish him every success in his new assignment," said President Pantzer. "As an outstanding teacher and administrator and noted author, he has made significant contributions to this institution."

"I want to express my gratitude for the support that the administration, under both President Pantzer and former President Johns, has given to the department of English and my pleasure at the opportunity I have had to work with many members of the academic community," said Dr. Carrier. "My years in Missoula have been among the happiest and most productive of my professional career. I wish my colleagues and the University well."

Before joining the UM College of Arts and Sciences in 1964, Dr. Carrier held teaching positions with Portland State, Deep Springs, Sweet Briar, Bennington and Bard colleges, University of Iowa, Boston University and University of North Carolina.

Dr. Carrier has taught a variety of courses in English and Spanish and has served with various UM faculty organizations including the Senate, Graduate Council and the Budget and Policy Committees.

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He is the founder and original editor of Quarterly Review of Literature, former associate editor of Western Review and a consulting editor for Northwest Review. He has been a special consultant to the Commissioner of Education in New York and a member of the Comparative and World Literature Committee of the National Council of Teachers of English.

Among Dr. Carrier's extensive writings are the novels, *The Hunt*, 1952, and *Bay of the Damned*, 1957; poems, *The Cost of Love*, 1953, and *Toward Montebello*, 1966; a book of poetry translation, *City Stopped in Time*; and a college textbook, *Reading Modern Poetry*.

Born in Cheviot, O., Dr. Carrier graduated with honors in 1942 from Miami University (Ohio) where he was named to Phi Beta Kappa scholastic honorary. He obtained his master's degree from Harvard University in 1948 and was awarded the Ph.D. degree at Occidental College in 1962. His graduate work was in comparative literature.

In 1944-45, he was an American Field Service volunteer attached to the British Army in India and Burma.

Dr. Carrier's wife, Marjorie, is Director of Project Headstart in Missoula. They have one son, Gregory, a graduate of Sentinel High in Missoula, and presently a student at Occidental College.

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
