

A concert by the Minneapolis Symphony Orchestra will be presented April 1 at the University of Montana, Missoula.

The orchestra will be under direction of Stanislaw Skrowaczewski and will feature Wanda Wilkomirska, violinist. The program is sponsored by the Program Council of the Associated Students at the University.

Curtain time for the performance is 8:15 p.m. in the University Theater on the Missoula campus. The 90-member orchestra's performance will be highlighted by four numbers from Ludvig van Beethoven's "Symphony No. 8 in F Major, Opus 93," a concerto for violin and orchestra by Karol Szymanowski and four musical selections from "Symphony No. 9 in E Minor, Opus 95," by Antonin Dvorak.

The Mimmeapolis Symphony was formed in 1903 and made its initial tour in 1906.

The orchestra now plays annually to approximately 420,000 patrons in 135 concerts.

Skrowaczewski, who has been orchestra conductor for seven years, is former music director of the National Philharmonic of Poland and has scored successes in guest-conducting engagements with orchestras in Cleveland, Philadelphia, New York, Berlin, Paris and Rome.

All tickets for the April performance are reserved and may be purchased at the Lodge desk and School of Music on the UM campus and at the Cart Wheelin downtown Missoula.
