### REGISTRATION FRIDAY FOR MONTANA SCIENCE FAIR

MISSOULA--

Registration for the Montana Science Fair will begin at 8 a.m. Friday, March 29 in the Men's Gymnasium at the University of Montana, Missoula. All entrants must be registered and all exhibits set-up by noon Friday.

The fair, one of three being held throughout the state this weekend, includes participants from grades 7 through 12 of schools throughout the area. The other two fairs will be held in Butte and Billings. Two grand prize winners from each of the three fairs will represent Montana at the International Science Fair in Detroit, Mich., May 14-18.

Judging of exhibits at the Missoula fair is scheduled for 1-5 p.m. Friday. Students participating in the fair will be entertained with a program at 3 p.m. Friday in the Music Recital Hall on the campus. Ed Leary, junior class delegate to Central Board, the UM student governing body will be master of ceremonies. The program will include a talk by Dr. Earl Lory, UM Academic Vice President, and entertainment by the University's well-known singing group, the Jubileers. The public is welcome to attend.

The fair will be open to the public from 6 p.m. until midnight Friday and from 8 a.m.-2 p.m. Saturday, March 30.

At noon Saturday a luncheon and presentation of awards is scheduled in the Territorial Room in the Lodge on the UM campus. Richard Solberg, UM associate dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, will speak. Dr. R.A. Diettert, UM professor of botany and director of the science fair, and Mr. Norman Jacobson, assistant professor of education and associate director of the fair, will present the awards, scholarships and prizes.
