MISSOULA--

At least six colleges and universities will challenge Montana State University's rodeo crown next week in Missoula during the University of Montana Rodeo.

The Bobcats from Bozeman walked off with top honors a year ago in the UM Rodeo, but this year's competition is expected to be a lot stiffer.

In addition to UM and MSU, other schools slated to participate in the UM Rodeo include Western Montana College, Dillon; Eastern Montana College, Billings; Northern Montana College, Havre, plus out-of-state representatives, Brigham Young University, Provo, Utah; Idaho State University, Pocatello, and several colleges and universities from Washington State.

The rodeo will be at 7:30 p.m. April 11-13 in the Harry Adams Field House on the Missoula campus. Admission fee will be \$1 per student and \$1.50 per adult. Preschool children will be admitted free.

Doug Holzum, Red Lodge, vice president of the UM Rodeo Club, said as many as 10 schools may be represented in the rodeo, which is approved by the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association, an affiliate of the Rodeo Cowboys Association.

Don Harrington, Butte, will be rodeo announcer.

The rodeo is sponsored by the UM Rodeo Club. Funds raised through the event will be used to pay stock contractor Ray Kohrs, Miller Creek. Any money remaining after expenses will be put into the Rodeo Club treasury.
