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MUGGERIDGE TO GIVE
"FOOL'S EYE VIEW"

MISSOULA---

Malcolm Muggeridge, British journalist and former editor of the British humor magazine "Punch," will speak Tuesday (April 9) at the University of Montana.

He will discuss "The World We Live In--Fool's Eye View" at 8 p.m. Tuesday in the University Theater on the Missoula campus. Muggeridge's visit to the campus is sponsored by the Program Council of the Associated Students at UM. The speech will be open to the public without charge.

A nonconformist, Muggeridge's background includes an honor's degree from Cambridge University at the age of 20, teaching at the Egyptian University in Cairo, reporting for the Manchester Guardian in England and later becoming the Guardian correspondent to Moscow as a result of his editorial-page ardor. On returning to England, he wrote "Winter in Moscow," a book described as "savagely critical" of the Russian movement.

Muggeridge also was a columnist for the London Evening Standard. He joined the Intelligence Corps in 1939 when war broke out. After six years in the corps and rising to the rank of major, he joined the Daily Telegraph in Washington, D.C., as a correspondent.

He became editor-in-chief of Punch in 1953, and after five successful years with that magazine, resigned in 1957. Muggeridge continues to write articles for publications in both England and the U.S.--including Esquire Magazine--as well as scripts for the British Broadcasting Co. Two of his latest books are "The Most of Malcolm Muggeridge" and "London A La Mode."

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
